




The Eye of the Trainer

The committee are busy undertaking the update of the Association's key documentation and there is a reminder in this newsletter regarding the proposed revisions to the Constitution that have been emailed to all full members. Please feel free to provide input into this process as the Association exists to serve the members and the committee needs to know what you think of what is proposed.


We have worked through the revision of the Code of Ethics and are now tackling the Code of Practice for the Endorsed Trainers and we hope to share these updated versions with you before the end of the year. The Endorsement application process is also being updated to align with the CANZ Accreditation process with the intention of positioning APDTNZ endorsed trainers amongst the leaders in the field of dog training across NZ.

Progress is also being made on compiling APDTNZ Position Statements on relevant matters pertaining to dog training and behaviour management. The first of these, regarding Dominance, is close to being finalised and this will be the start of a resource package to assist members in informing clients and the public on how to ensure the best outcomes are achieved for their dogs.

Finally, one more reminder, and this one is about helping drive more clients your way for those that operate a business. I strongly encourage members to ensure that their member profiles on the webpage are complete and current. People are accessing this information or being directed to this page in order to find a reputable trainer. If your information about your location, the services you offer etc. are not in your profile then you will not come up on the search function. The more information you have there the better the chance you have of being presented as the solution that someone is looking for. If you are unsure of how to update your information, please get in touch and someone will get back to you.

Keep up the great work that you do and keep sharing your successes and advice, particularly on social media. It is fantastic to see what our members get up to and see the impact you are having on the lives of people and their dogs.

CHANGES ARE COMING: THE CONSTITUTION IS EVOLVING



We are changing. All for the better! Changes are necessary to grow and reflect the evolving climate of dog trainers in New Zealand.

That means, changes to the constitution. And we want your input!

The Association has been in existence for just over 10 years and the committee has been undertaking a review of our key documents to ensure that they reflect current practices and expectations.

A number of proposed updates to the constitution have been sent for member review and comment.

The changes can be summarised as follows:

- Amend the name to "Association of Professional Dog Trainers New Zealand"
- A number of grammar amendments to ensure consistency of terminology
- Aligning the process for life and Honorary members
- Deletion or amendment of clauses that are no longer relevant due to changes in technology and the way we process payments
- Addition of headings to assist in finding relevant clauses
- Addition of a clause referencing the endorsement or accreditation of members
- Addition of role definition for "Vice President"
- Addition of the term "Full Member" to align with current practices
- Creation of the "Membership Secretary" role, outside of committee
- Amendment to allow the committee to set the annual membership fees
- Allowing the appointment of a Reviewer as an alternative to an Auditor
- Minor other consequential changes in relation to the above

This feedback will be summarised and circulated with an updated version of the amendments as appropriate requesting confirmation by at least 15 voting members to take this to a Special General Meeting.

APDTNZ Trainer Endorsement Programme (TEP)

The TEP aims to become a benchmark for qualified and experienced trainers so the public, as well as other dog trainers, can confidently seek them out.

Endorsement is maintained every 3 years via continuing education and activity points to encourage trainers to further their own knowledge across the fields of dog training, education, and behaviour. Endorsed trainers will be highlighted on the APDTNZ website and have the right to use the APDTNZ endorsed trainer logo.

How to apply:

- The TEP is open to Full Members.
- Complete a self-assessment against the entry criteria.
- Submit an application for endorsement along with supporting documentation and an application fee.

All applications will be reviewed by a panel.






